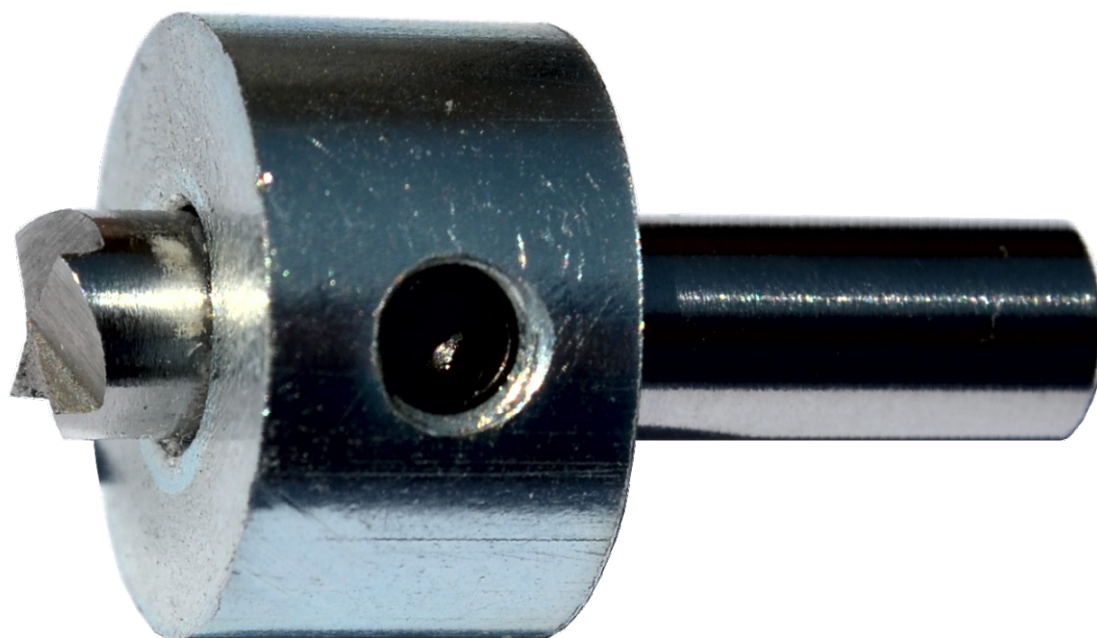


MAMBA Primer Pocket Uniformer

For cutting primer pockets uniformly to the same depth

- Most manufacturers punch the primer pocket into cartridge case head;
- Therefore all cases do not have equally deep primer pockets, and the bottom usually has a radius. This causes the primers to be seated unevenly and to different depths;
- It could cause some primers to protrude from the rear of the case, which is dangerous because it could cause a slam fire;
- Primers should be seated to 2 Thou, or 0.05mm, below the surface of the case head;
- For safety and uniform ignition it is strongly advised that the primer pockets be cut to the same depth;
- This is done with the **MAMBA** primer pocket uniformer;
- This procedure is done only once, and always on new cases;
- Whilst cutting, often clean out shavings from the primer pocket;
- To clean the primer pockets after firing, use the appropriate tool for the job. Do not use the **MAMBA** primer pocket uniformer for cleaning. The burnt residue of the fired primer is very hard and abrasive and it will lead to excessive wear of the uniformer's cutting edges.



- The **MAMBA** Primer Pocket Uniformer is all-metal;
- It comes already set to correct cutting depth;
- The cutter is manufactured with engineering quality SOMTA High Speed Tool Steel that will retain its sharp cutting edges for a long time.
